

We are seeking contributions that provide insight, potential solutions, and examples of action on the ground. Abstracts and posters will be published online. In addition, we are negotiating a special issue of the leading journal Landscape Ecology to publish selected papers and syntheses from conference discussions.

The multidisciplinary conference will appeal to anyone with an interest in landscape protection, planning, and management, including researchers, policymakers, and practitioners.
